From the Desk of Your Public Works Director:

Sidewalk Maintenance - Owners and Citizens Responsibility

The owners of the property within the City limits are required to maintain all sidewalks adjacent to their property in a condition that is safe for use by the public "AT ALL TIMES". If any property owner by their neglect to perform any duty required of them by this section causes injury or damage to any person or property, they shall be liable to the person suffering such injury or damage and shall indemnify the city of all damages it has been compelled to pay in such cases. Such damages may be collected in a civil action against the property owner. [RRMC 12.10.060]

We are trying to increase citizen's awareness that they are required to maintain the vegetation from their landscape in a manner to insure safe use or passage on the City sidewalks. The City spends significant resources to make sure that the sidewalks are clear and passable. However this is really the property owner's responsibility and liability in most cases. So please keep your trees trimmed up and cleaned up! All other vegetation "MUST" be cut back in order to maintain safe passage. We are now seeing school start and we don't want children competing with cars when a sidewalk should be available. Also all vegetation needs to be cut back in an effort to not obscure line of site at intersection and driveways. Let's all stay safe and do our part to keep our beautiful City safe for all pedestrian passage.
